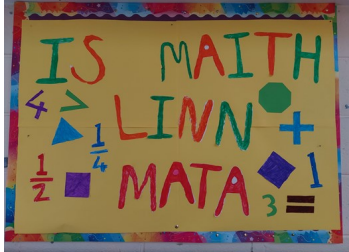
School Uniform

Active Week

The children had great fun during Active Week! There were different activities in the yard each day. The children even took on the teachers in a giant game of dodgeball!

Active homework included a Spell Your Name workout challenge. The children designed their own obstacle course and some put their engineering skills to practice making courses at home using toys and other household items.

We brought our classroom outdoors, incorporating active literacy skills with an Alphabet Scavenger Hunt. We finished the week with a yard disco where the children showed their impressive dance moves!

The importance of physical activity from an early age contributes hugely to a child's development. It enhances and promotes the development of motor skills, bones and muscles, as well as cognitive and social skills.



Curious Minds Awards



We are very proud to have been awarded a gold Curious Mind Award for all of our hard work in STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths). All classes worked hard to achieve this award and engaged in many creative projects over the year. Teachers also completed 3 workshops during the year on STEM education to enhance the children's learning. Well done to all of our classes for a successful year of STEM in St. Mary's JNS!

Tree Planting in Collinstown Park

First and Second classes enjoyed planting trees in Collinstown Park this term. Thank you to Niall, the park ranger, who met us and helped us plant the trees at the entrance of the park. Outdoor learning

The children have really enjoyed learning outdoors throughout the year! All classes have been busy planting in our school garden and looking after our trees in the Stepping Stone Forest. The children loved using our Classroom in the Sun to do activities in all curriculum areas.



Computers and ICT

We were delighted to be able to get 4 new Interactive Whiteboards for four classes. We bring ICT into the classrooms through this and with other interactive technology including Ipads, computers and “BeeBots”.

We have a range of software for educational use. Children across the school use Ipads as part of learning activities and in class stations. Teachers and parents communicate using the Aladdin Connect App.

Wellbeing Week

We held a Wellbeing Week in March this year. We had a lot of fun doing Buddy Reading, yoga, dance classes, meditation and mindfulness colouring. To top off a fun filled week we had a visit from a very funny magician.

Christmas Cards for Nursing Homes

As part of the Amber Flag initiative, we decided to spread some Christmas cheer this Christmas. The boys and girls worked hard (just like the elves in Santa's Workshop) to make Christmas Cards for local nursing homes. They posted their cards in special postboxes and some members of the Children's Wellbeing Committee presented the boxes to Santa - who delivered them to the Nursing Homes. What wonderful Christmas Spirit shown by all!



Grandparents Day

In January we celebrated Grandparents Day by inviting in all the wonderful grandparents of the boys and girls. Each class group went down to the hall, spent time with their grandparents, showed them their artwork and sang a few songs before heading back to class. It was an enjoyable day for all and the children were so excited to have their grandparents come in to see them.



Creative schools

We continued with our Creative Schools Journey working with two other schools in the area in a creative cluster. Ms Murray has been working on this with the other schools and it will continue into next year .

Incubator Project

Second class was lucky enough to take part in the incubator project and 3 chicks hatched. The chicks were getting bigger every day and all the children loved visiting the classroom to meet them. The chicks have been named, Rocky, Folen and Beauty by the children in second class. The children have loved learning about the chicks. The chicks have now gone back to Norevalley Park pet farm.



North Clondalkin Library

The Library will be running a “**Summer Stars**” **Reading Programme** this summer. Children can go to the Library and read lots of wonderful books over the summer and claim their free goodie bags once completed. Summer reading is so important!

Staff meetings take place outside of school times under the Croke Park Agreement.

We have increased the amount of time spent on Literacy and Numeracy activities.

Team Teaching allows teachers work with small groups giving more individual attention.

We meet parents of new infants in June & September.

Learning Support and Special Educational Needs

The school follows ‘The Continuum of Support’ Model. This has three stages.

Stage 1 is where the teacher or parent sees that a child is having some difficulties. They meet to discuss these and put a Classroom Support Plan in place.

At **Stage 2** the concern is referred to a Learning Support Teacher who offers advice and a School Support Plan is developed further.

Stage 3 is where the child is referred to outside professionals for assessment e.g. for speech and language etc. We call this School Support Plus. Parents have a very important role to play and should discuss any concerns with the class teacher, home school teacher or principal.

Reading & Maths Recovery:

Reading Recovery is an intensive programme which runs for about 18 weeks. It provides children with a great opportunity for 1:1 support with reading. If you have concerns about your child’s reading please speak with his/her teacher.

The Maths Recovery programme provides intensive support to individuals, small groups and classes in Maths. If you are concerned about your child’s Maths speak to the class teacher. Teachers engage in ‘team teaching’ which means smaller groups for Maths and English.

Delivering Equality in Schools: (DEIS):

Our school is part of the DEIS Programme. This supports smaller classes, school lunches, after school clubs, tours and trips, summer camps, in-school and after school activities. We try to ensure that all the children benefit as much as possible. This programme also ensures we have extra learning support staff and special posts such as Home School Community Liaison Teacher and Support Teacher.

Standardised Tests and Learner Experiences

Standardised Tests have been completed and results have been reviewed by teachers. The results are also presented to the Board of Management. Summer reports give children's STEN scores in reading and numeracy. Parents can speak with the class teacher about their child's results.

Learner Experiences: Team teaching, station teaching and paired reading have helped to greatly improve the quality of independent writing and reading. All children really enjoy reading and writing and experiencing success. The teachers would like to thank parents for supporting children by listening to their reading, and encouraging reading at home.

Literacy and Numeracy

We have been working with the new Language Curriculum and teachers have attended more training this year. We look forward to welcoming the new Numeracy Curriculum next year.

Children received books from North Clondalkin Library and accessed the wide variety of books in the school library. Children read a wide range of books and wrote in different styles and for different audiences. We focus on our Oral language and vocabulary through our thematic planning and Aistear. Teachers follow the Jolly Phonics Programme for teaching phonics, Oxford Reading Tree for Reading and write in many different genres throughout the year.

Teachers in the infant class use Number Worlds and Ready Set Go Maths for Numeracy. We have an exciting oral language programme through Irish called Bua na Cainte .



Home School Community Liaison HSCL

Sarah Mc Donald was our HSCL teacher this year. Many thanks to Sarah for all her work during the year. Patricia Mc Loughlin will be our new HSCL teacher next year. We would like to wish Ms McLoughlin all the best in her new role as she looks forward to working with all the families in the school.

Here are some of the initiatives and programmes as part of the HSCL scheme this year.

Parents Committee: We were delighted to continue the Parents' Committee this year. The Parents' Committee helped out with different events and activities this year, including our Grandparents day and Making Goody Bags for all the children for the Toy Show to name a few.

Parents helped with reviewing the Anti Bullying Policy and also our Healthy Eating Policy. I would like to thank all the parents for their support in activities this year. If any parents would like to join the Parents' Committee next year, please do!.

Links with North Clondalkin Library:

We continue to work with North Clondalkin Library. Our classes attend the library in Senior Infants, First and Second Class and enjoy listening to stories being read and selecting books to borrow. Aoife from the Library visited the Junior Infants and Special classes this year and read stories to the children. Parents and children can join the library for free and avail of all its wonderful resources. This year the library provided our CLOVER books for the Junior Infants and will provide a set of books for the new incoming Junior Infants for registering for the Library.

We would like to thank the staff of the library for working with us throughout the year. The library run a range of different adult education courses and family friendly events too. Call into the library for more information.

Walking on Mondays: A community walking group met on Monday mornings in Term 1 at the entrance of Collinstown Park for a walk followed a coffee in North Clondalkin Library. Well done to all those who participated. We hope to restart this again in September.

Transitions Across the school.

In October, we welcomed the parents of our current Junior Infants to a coffee morning with Sarah and the Junior infant teachers. This was a great opportunity for parents to visit the school and ask any questions. These meetings allowed us to share information about teaching and learning in Junior Infants and offer advice for supporting your child's learning journey at home.

June is a busy month for transitions. Our current 2nd class students visited the Senior School where they had a tour of the corridors, classrooms, yard and PE hall. Our current 2nd class parents were invited to a transition coffee morning in the Senior School. Many thanks to all of those who attended.

We welcomed our incoming Junior Infants this month too with their parents on a visit to meet their teachers. We have 3 new Junior Infant classes starting in September. They will join us in Junior Infants when school reopens on Tuesday the 29th of August. The children saw their classroom and met their new teacher. They all received a welcome pack and a preparation for school at St. Mary's booklet.

Literacy hour: It was a treat to be able to welcome parents back into the school this year. Parents helped in Senior Infants and Second Classes with Literacy Hour where the children did Literacy Stations working on reading, phonics and writing. We hope to continue this next year. Thank you to all who participated.

Gardening Workshop: Some parents and children took part in our gardening workshop this year. We weeded and planted different flowers, vegetables and fruit. All involved enjoyed our Monday mornings.

Links with Archways/ Blue Skies: Blueskies support the school with different courses and programmes for teachers and parents. Blue Skies provide training for teachers in Incredible Years Programme. This supports positive behaviour and our "Show me 5" rules. They provide transition documents also to support our new junior infants coming into school. Blue Skies is providing a summer course in Restorative Practice to some teachers in our school this summer.

Links with Community Gardaí. We would like to thank the community Gardaí for working with us this year and coming to the school to celebrate and present Ollie in Senior Infants with a medal for being a real life Hero.

Santa Claus: In December, Santa made a special visit to St Mary's JNS to see all the boys and girls. He left a selection box for all the children and enjoyed listening and joining in with singing Christmas Songs.

SCP—School Completion Programme: The Collinstown Park School Completion Programme is a programme that helps students to attend school, focus on completing school, get involved in class and school activities and get the most from their education. Emma Kiernan is the programme coordinator. SCP have funded after school clubs and one to one and group project work in the school this year.

Parents Plus: Well done to all the parents who took part in the Parents Plus programme in September. This course works with parents and supports them in parenting and supporting their children.

Cool Dudes: This was a cooking course for parents and children that ran over 6 weeks. The parents and children from our school enjoyed making healthy, easy recipes together. Well done to all the parents and children who engaged with this course.

CLOVER Project (Children Learn On Very Early Reading). Junior Infants take part in the Clover Literacy Project. The aim is to instill a love of reading in young children. Aoife from North Clondalkin Library joined in the parents' workshop. Each child received a CLOVER pack to bring home with a Literacy focused story book, a Numeracy focused story book and a colouring book and colouring pencils.
